

Pittsburgh's First Public Radio Station

What began as an experiment on the campus of Duquesne University in 1949 has blossomed into an important regional source for news and jazz programming. With more than 190,000 listeners per week, WDUQ is the Pittsburgh region's most listened to public radio station. DUQ proudly celebrates its 60th anniversary, while continuing to build listener support, strengthen its community, and provide the best programming possible.

News

DUQ's award-winning local news department provides in-depth coverage of important regional issues, and regularly broadcasts those stories to a national audience on NPR's syndicated news progams. DUQ also produces news stories for grant-funded initiatives, including previous series on the region's workforce, sustainability issues, and Pittsburgh's history. All our news stories are available via broadcast and the web.

Jazz

Jazz is an important part of Pittsburgh's history and DUQ is proud to be the region's premier jazz station, playing more than 100 hours of jazz weekly. Along with on-air broadcasting, DUQ programs JazzWorks, a jazz service syndicated to stations around the country. DUQ also produces nationally syndicated jazz programs, including the recent *Nordic Jazz Festival*, and the big band and swing program *Rhythm Sweet and Hot*.

NPR

In 1971, DUQ became a charter member of the newly formed National Public Radio. It has been Pittsburgh's flagship NPR station ever since, airing popular programs including *Morning Edition, All Things Considered, Car Talk*, and *Fresh Air with Terry Gross.*
